## **Honoring Obedience**

"Honor your father and your mother so that you may live long in the land the Lord your God is giving you."

(Exodus 20:12 NIV)

Boaz, who later became her kinsman-redeemer, told Ruth, "I've been told all about what you have done for your mother-in-law since the death of your husband – how you left your father and mother and your homeland and came to live with a people you did not know before. May the Lord repay you for what you have done. May you be richly rewarded by the Lord the God of Israel, under whose wings you have come to take refuge" (Ruth 2:11-12).

Even though Naomi was Ruth's mother-in-law, she treated her as though she was her own mother. We see from Ruth an example of how she honored Naomi. Ruth stayed with Naomi in her time of need, she spent time with Naomi when no one else was around, she became Naomi's friend when her husband died and no one else was left, she served God with Naomi, and she provided food for Naomi when she could not provide for herself.

We can see more of Ruth's character in her great-grandson King David and his obedience to the Lord. King David's heart was much like Ruth's heart. When we read David's Psalms, it seems that much of the love, honor, and obedience to God that defined Ruth's life was passed on to her great-grandson.
